# IF INFLATION IS FIZZLING OUT, CAN PROFITS BE FAR BEHIND?

For decades, experts at the US Federal Reserve, academic economists and portfolio managers have been at war with inflation — the phenomenon of price increases without commensurate productivity gains. Investors and policymakers alike hate inflation because it robs consumers of buying power and discourages money flows into long-term investments for fear that their value will be eroded. The remedy for inflation in past cycles has been for central banks to raise interest rates in order to cool off growth and end speculative investing, thus curbing broad-based consumer price increases. Usually inflation flare-ups occur a couple of years into a cycle, or at mid-cycle at the latest. This time, the cycle is getting old — very old — but inflation remains surprisingly tame, running well behind previous US cycles. Meanwhile, similar patterns are playing out globally. 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DEVON ALPHA FUND

#### FUND OUTLINE

The Alpha Fund invests in a concentrated portfolio of approximately 10 to 15 select companies predominantly listed on the NZ and Australian share markets.

The Fund does not follow any index, is actively managed and aims to generate capital growth over the long term. Currency exposure is actively managed.

#### DEVON ALPHA FUND

During the month we participated in a capital raising by Pushpay. This business is a major participant in the provision of mobile commerce solutions to the faith sector and is now servicing many of the largest church groups across the US. The company raised US\$25m to accelerate their growth towards an FY18 revenue target of US\$70m representing year-onyear growth of greater than 100%. The fund raising will go to the development of a sales force in the US and the company expects to list in the US over the next 3-years. Its shares rallied by almost 40% from the price we paid for our stock during this process. Offsetting the contribution from this investment were negative returns generated by Westfield and Spark Infrastructure. We continue to hold a large cash balance in the strategy and hope opportunities for investment will present themselves over the upcoming Reporting Season.

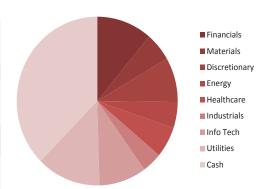

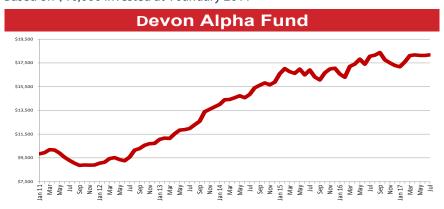

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#### **July 2017** MONTHLY REPORT

DEVON **AUSTRALIAN FUND** 

#### FUND OUTLINE

The Australian Fund is actively managed and invests in a select portfolio of approximately 25 to 35 companies which are primarily Australian listed companies.

The Australian market is much larger than the NZ market and offers exposure to a number of sectors that are not available in NZ. The Australian dollar currency exposure of this Fund is typically unhedged.

#### DEVON AUSTRALIAN FUND

During July one of the most significant positive contributors to performance was BHP Billiton. We lifted our weighting to this company in June after forming a view that its share price was trading at an attractive discount to our assessment of its fair value. Supported by stronger than expected economic data out of China the major mining stocks in Australia all per-formed well during the month but BHP was notable, rallying by over 11%. The company also reported a credible quarterly production report with iron ore shipments from the Pilbara rising by 14%. Other strong performance contributions came from our investments in ANZ and Woolworths. Unfortunately these returns were offset by the weaker share prices of CSL, GTN and Brambles. We are looking forward to the coming month as the Reporting Season will provide us with great insights into the current operating performances of our companies.

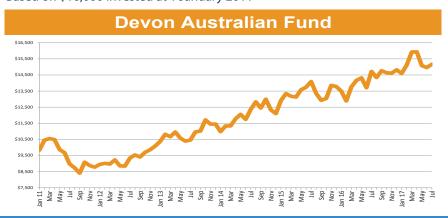

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DEVON DIVERSIFIED INCOME FUND

#### FUND OUTLINE

The Devon Diversified Income Fund aims to give New Zealanders access to a diverse and good quality portfolio of high yielding investments.

The Fund aims to generate better-than-bank income rates by investing in a carefully selected portfolio of government and corporate bonds, cash, listed property, infrastructure, utility companies, high yielding equities, credit securities and other yielding financial assets.

# DE VON DIVERSIFIED INCOME FUND

Fixed interest markets were reasonably stable during the month although we did see bond yields in Europe lift on speculation that the ECB will soon look to follow the Federal Reserve's lead and begin a process of interest rate normalisation. This sentiment is broadly consistent with the change of tone being seen by many central banks around the world as an increasing amount of policy guidance is being tilted towards the gradual removal of stimulus. This is despite a world without much evidence of inflation. In New Zealand, second-quarter CPI was reported as 0.0% which was below market expectations of 0.2%. With annual inflation currently running at 1.7% it is unlikely that the RBNZ will be lifting rates domestically in the short-term. Compounding this position is the strong New Zealand Dollar which rallied almost 2.5% during the month to finish above \$0.75.

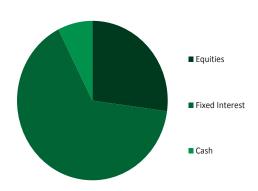

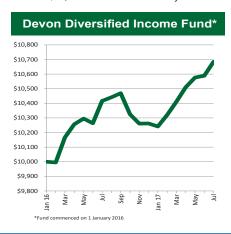

# DEVON DIVIDEND YIELD FUND

#### FUND OUTLINE

The Devon Dividend Yield Fund consists of a select group of up to 25-35 New Zealand and Australian listed companies.

These stocks are chosen for their attractive dividend yields and growth prospects with the aim of maintaining the dividend yield and capital value in real terms. The Australian dollar currency exposure is typically fully hedged.

# DEVON DIVIDEND YIELD FUND

During the month our portfolio holding Super Retail Group made a number of announcements which were well received by the market. On the earnings front the company has highlighted that they believe FY17 earnings will be at the top end of their previous guidance. This was important given investor concerns over Amazon developing it's presence in Australia. Also management announced a strategic initiative to convert its network of Amart Sports stores into new Rebel stores and focus on building one retail sports brand. Our exposure to the Australian banks also generated positive performance during the month after the banking regulator, APRA, delivered a softer-than-expected capital target for the sector. Although the major banks all currently have Core Equity levels which are below the new requirement, it is expected that all of them will be able to achieve compliance organically. This was a positive surprise for the market.

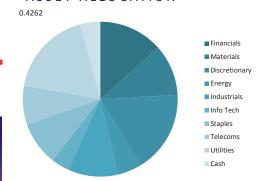

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DEVON TRANS-TASMAN FUND

#### FUND OUTLINE

The Trans-Tasman Fund provides a broad and actively managed exposure to the NZ and Australian equity markets.

This Fund typically holds 25 to 35 shares listed on the NZ and Australian stock exchanges which have been carefully selected as offering good value and attractive medium term growth prospects. The Australian dollar currency exposure is typically unhedged.

#### **DEVON TRANS-TASMAN FUND**

Vista Group is an exciting business that we own in the Trans-Tasman Fund. During the month our portfolio managers attended an Investor Day which was hosted by the company. It was an opportunity for their executives to discuss corporate strategy and highlight the opportunities currently available to them. Included amongst these is the transition of their Cinema division to a Cloud based architecture. This will be completed by early 2019 and will result in an improved customer experience and a reduction in operating costs. Also discussed was the progress being made in their MXticket business. This initiative creates a connection between ticketing vendors and Cinema Exhibitors and we believe has significant economic potential. Overall this business continues to leverage off its strong incumbent position and has a range of exciting opportunities ahead of it. There were no major changes made to this portfolio during the month.

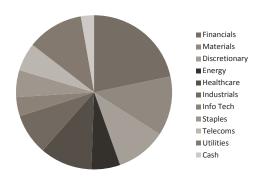

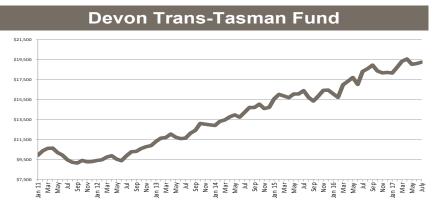
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#### NET PERFORMANCE Based on \$10,000 invested at 1 January 2011

#### FUND OUTLINE

The Global Themes Fund invests in Global Financial Assets predominently Global Exchange Traded Funds (ETF's). We identify macroeconomic or thematic investment ideas with a 2-5 year time horizon, and implement the investment ideas through appropriate high quality assets. Portfolio risk is managed by ensuring broad diversification, ample liquidity and close monitoring of tracking variation versus a passive equity benchmark. The Global Themes strategy has been run by JBWere since March 2005. In October 2014 Devon Funds Management created a NZ PIE Fund to follow the Global Themes strategy and has appointed JBWere as the adviser.

#### FUND UPDATE

Our portfolio tread water in July, lagging broad markets. The US dollar extended its weakness through the month - now its worst run since 2011. A sense of political disarray in the White House, alongside signs of a resurgent Europe have encouraged investors to abandon the Greenback for other currencies. We have intentionally positioned our portfolio to benefit from rising US interest rates and a bull market in US dollars. Accordingly, our portfolio tends to lag when the US dollar is under pressure. Notwithstanding the travails of the USD in July, we firmly believe we are on the right track with our positioning. Importantly, the  $\ensuremath{\mathsf{US}}$ economy is proving to be a formidable jobs engine, hiring an average of 200,000 new jobs per month for around five years now. This is pushing unemployment lower and lower, and consumer confidence higher and higher (the number of households describing jobs as plentiful hit a 16 year high in July). Ultimately we expect these conditions to lead to wage growth, rising interest rates, and a stronger US dollar. This will directly benefit our holdings in US Banks, which remains one of our favourite portfolio tilts. Indirectly, USD strength will also assist our European investments, which aren't enjoying the sharp rebound in the Euro. In our view ECB President Mario Draghi will look to stand in the way of Euro strength if it continues. Accordingly, the month to month ebb and flow of currency and interest rates does not perturb us. Our big picture is that the US will begin behaving like an economy that is in its third longest expansion ever (which it is). Investors will do well to not lose sight of this.

India was our best performing theme during July, on the back of continued progress in government reforms and a strengthening of Modi's government following key regional elections. Quarterly earnings season in the US and Europe is well underway, and we are broadly

pleased with what we are seeing. Our largest sector exposures in the US (Technology, Banks and Healthcare) have all delivered positive earnings surprises. While we have been somewhat disappointed with the composition of Banks' earnings, we are seeing solid growth in the Medical Devices space, as well as in those companies leading the "transition to the cloud" (Microsoft, Amazon, Alphabet). We saw this reflected in Technology stock prices this month, however uncertainty around healthcare reform in the US dampened Medical Device names. In Europe, earnings have beaten expectations broadly across market sectors. European banks in particular continue to report better than expected results, however of particular interest to us is the continued improvement we are seeing in Telco names, given our exposure to this sector. We see these companies as increasingly well placed to continue to deliver both revenue and earnings growth.

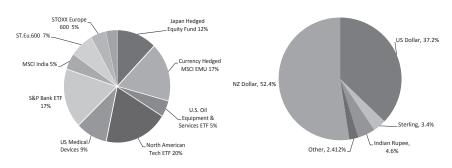
The Global Themes Fund was flat in July, finishing the month at a unit price of \$2.5304. This compares with a 1.5% rise in our global equity benchmark. Our fund has risen 9.0% per annum since inception net of fees, versus 10.3% growth in the iShares MSCI All Country World Index Exchange Traded Fund (50% hedged to NZD).

#### Currency exposures

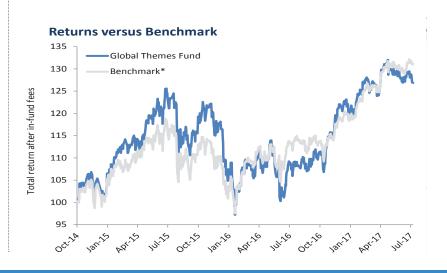
We continue to hold the currency hedge level in the fund at its benchmark weight of 50%. New Zealand house sales have yet to show signs of life after posting ~20% declines off their highs. Until we see a turn here, further upside risk to the Kiwi dollar looks limited, particularly from current levels, as the RBNZ will feel reluctant to tighten policy quickly.
