What is the purpose of this update?

This document tells you how the Devon Australian Fund has performed and what fees were charged. The document will help you to compare the fund with other funds. Devon Funds Management Limited prepared this update in accordance with the Financial Markets Conduct Act 2013. This information is not audited and may be updated.

Description of this fund

A select portfolio of companies which are primarily Australian listed companies. The Australian market offers exposure to a number of sectors that are not available in New Zealand. The Australian Fund is actively managed, which means the holdings and investment returns may differ considerably from its benchmark. The Fund tends to be fully invested in shares but can hold cash.

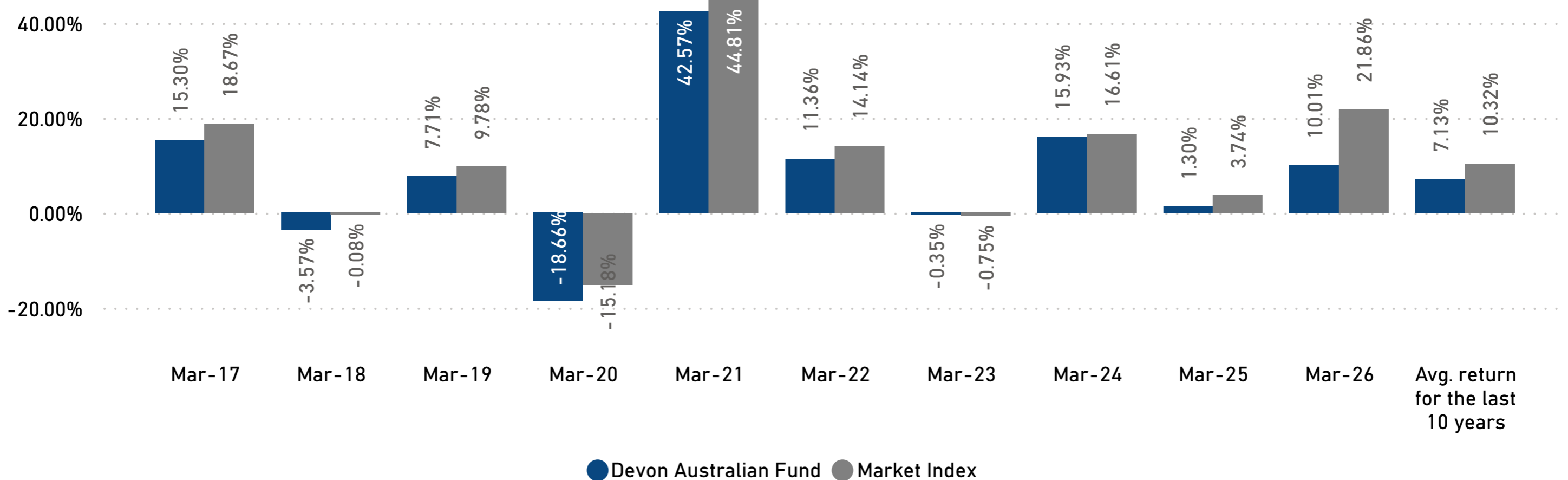

What are the risks of investing?

Risk indicator for the Devon Australian Fund:

Example of how this applies to an investor

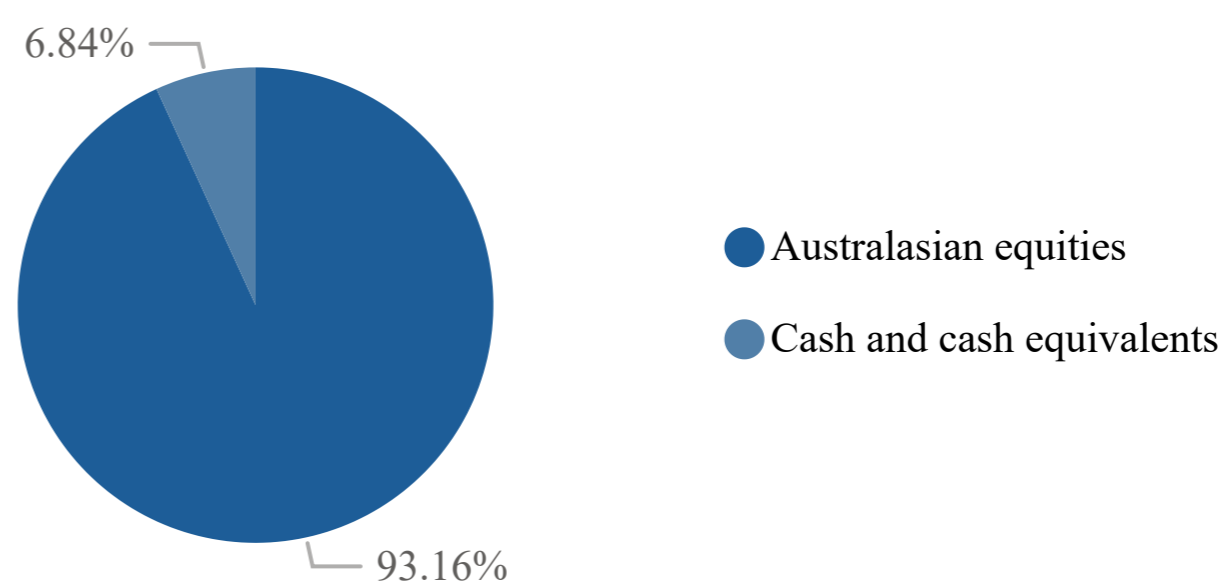
Small differences in fees and charges can have a big impact on your investments over the long term.

Chris had \$10,000 in the Devon Australian Fund at the start of the year and did not make any further contributions. At the end of the year, Chris received a return after fund charges were deducted of \$1,074 (that is 10.74% of his initial \$10,000). Chris does not pay any other charges. This gives Chris a total return after tax of \$1,001 for the year.
